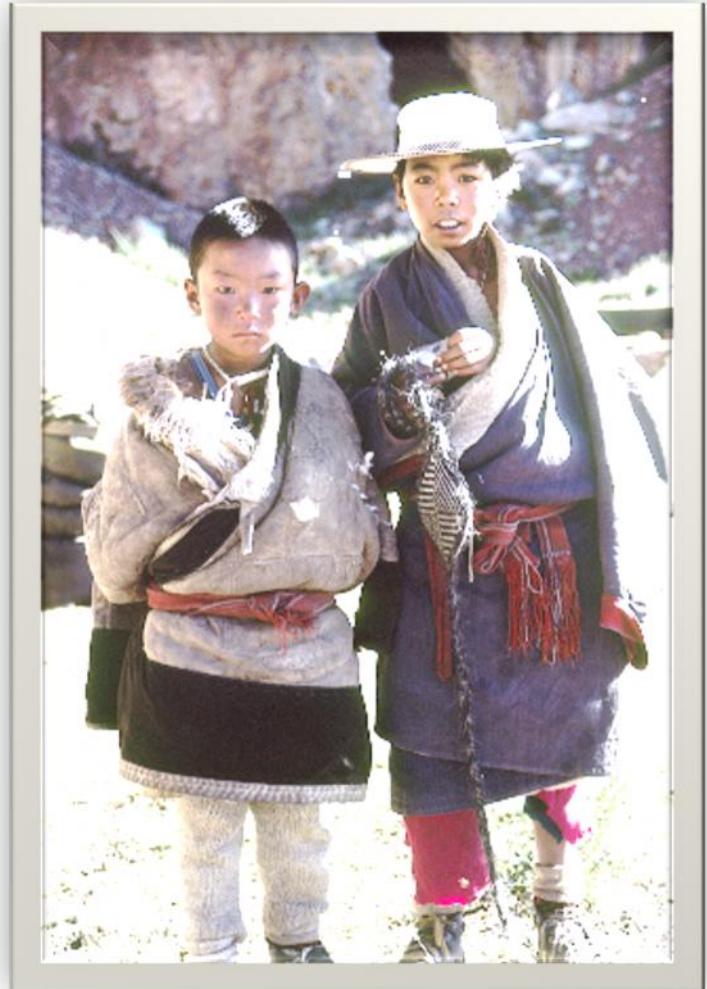

CHINESE AMERICAN NIGHT, AUGUST 4, 2013

Our Chinese American Night 2014 was completely amazing! The stars were aligned to give us the most glorious evening of the entire summer! Our audience of thousands turned out in full force to enjoy it all. There was huge interest in our preshow on the lawn which included a Chinese puppet show, a major Tai Chi class demonstration, musicians, calligraphers and great arts and crafts for the children. A scholarship presentation as well as an honoree ceremony for outstanding Chinese American citizens took place that evening prior to the show.

Our audience enjoyed CCLI's energetic, exuberant lions and dragon dancers who become more skillful every year. Well known Pianist Liu Jian came from the People's Republic of China to perform and to compose an original piano composition on stage amazing the audience with his talent.

The New York Chinese Chorus treated the audience to a lovely medley of Chinese favorites. The audience was delighted with the talents of the Authentic Shaolin Kung Fu Troupe whose Kung Fu Master Gregg Zilb broke a spear using only the muscles in his neck. This is an ancient Shaolin move seldom seen today.

A brick juggler, a plate spinner and a contortionist were also entertaining and were enjoyed by all. Soprano Lauren Haber, who is not Chinese learned to sing "Jasmine" in Mandarin specifically for a duet with Tenor Arthur Lai. The Peking Opera double sword dancer moved gracefully through his dance. One of the most memorable performances of the evening was the dance performed by our CCLI Chinese Traditional Dancers who wowed the audience with their drums and multicolored ribbons fluttering in the wind.

COCONUT GELATIN DESSERT FROM MAPLE PAU

4 packets powdered gelatin (Knox unflavored gelatin) less than 4 tablespoons total

1 cup lukewarm water

1 ½ cups water

1 cup sugar

1 can (14 ounce) coconut milk

2 ½ cups milk

Sprinkle 4 packages gelatin over 1 cup of lukewarm water and let sit for a few minutes. Stir well and set aside.

Heat 1 ½ cups of water, sugar and coconut milk, until hot. Stir until the sugar is dissolved.

Remove from heat.

Add 2 ½ cups milk and stir until well mixed. Pour into 9x13 pan. Allow to cool slightly before putting it in the refrigerator for about 2 hours.

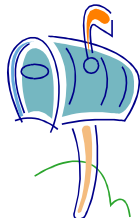

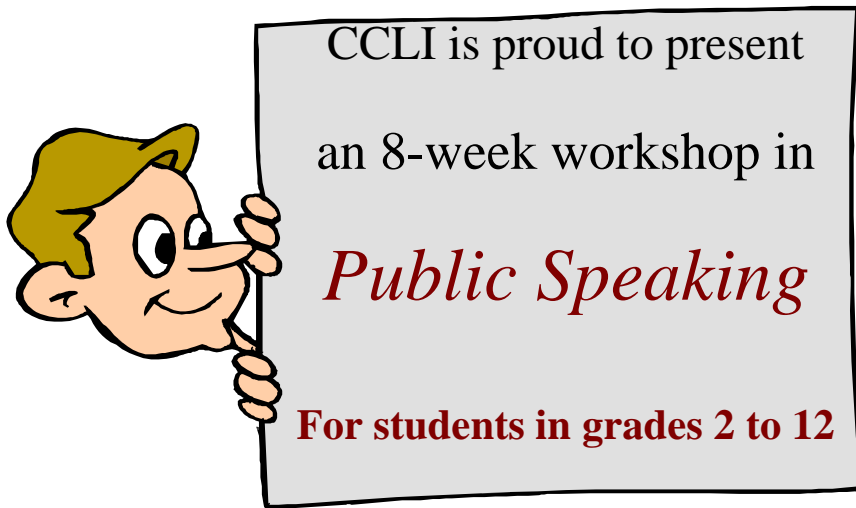
